Elements of Design

Skill:

- Identify and use primary colors: red, yellow, and blue
- Identify and use shapes: circle, square, triangle, rectangle, and oval
- Identify and use line and line variations: zigzag, dotted, wavy, and spiral
- Identify and use visual tactile texture
- Demonstrate the ability to recognize size relationships

Performance:

- Create art from imaginary sources of inspiration using the primary colors
- Observe and draw people
- Recognize various types of line variations (zigzag, dotted, wavy, and spiral) in the classroom environment
- Create texture from found objects through rubbings
- Draw big and small shapes in a work of art

Principles of Design

Skill:

- Identify symmetry in a picture
- Understand how shape and color can make a pattern

Performance:

- Recognize symmetry in a picture
- Use shapes and colors in a pattern

Skill:

- Name a master artist and describe unique characteristics of his/her style of work

Performance:

- Create a piece of art using a specific artist's style

Art as a Means for Communicating and Reflecting Emotions, Ideas, and Perspectives

Skill:

- Describe similarities between works of art
- Describe colors and shapes in a work of art
- Use senses of vision, touch, and hearing as inspirations for works of art
- Identify and describe works of art that communicate feelings, ideas, and information

Performance:

- Respond orally to works of art with reference to primary colors, line, texture, shape, and pattern
- Describe and discuss the ideas and emotions communicated in works of art
